ROOD SOFETY WEEK

Next week in school the assembly theme is road safety. Throughout the week, children will learn about the importance of using zebra crossings, looking both ways before crossing road and understanding traffic signals. We encourage you to discuss this at home to reinforce the importance of responsible and safe road behaviour.

Whilst on the subject of road safety, since returning to school last week, we have received lots of phone calls from residents complaining yet again about inconsiderate parking. Please park considerately when dropping off/collecting children, do not block residents drives and especially don't park anywhere it makes it dangerous for children and adults to cross the road, this includes on the yellow lines. You also need to check you have left enough room for an emergency vehicle (ambulance, fire engine etc) to get through. Anyone collecting a child by car must never park on the zigzag road markings. This is a road traffic offence and you will receive a fine. The zigzags are there to keep children safe. I have contacted the Local Authority who will send traffic wardens to carry out random spot checks and they will issue fines.
