# Remote Learning Plan



The school has adopted a tiered approach:

- I. Whole school closure
- 2. Bubble closure
- 3. Individual child self-isolating

## In the event of a whole school closure:

To prepare and plan for the possibility of closure it is essential that school collates the following information from families:

- Updated phone numbers for school correspondence including email addresses where appropriate.
- Consent for the delivery of resources and packs
- Google Classroom log ins created for all children
- Availability of electronic device tracking

#### Curriculum

Spring Vale Primary School is committed to ensuring that all children receive a quality education in the form that has been designed by the school. Therefore, the school is committed to ensuring that any remote learning is aligned to the school curriculum. This ensures the school community maintains cohesion and children are collectively enthused by their learning. Our curriculum aims will therefore continue to be delivered by ensuring teachers take ownership of a blended remote learning package with children's individual needs being accounted for. 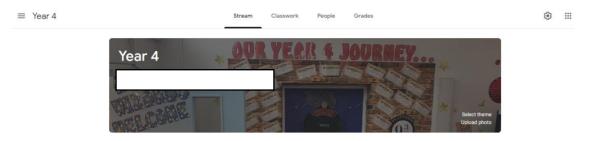

Spring Vale Primary School recognises the importance of face-to-face sessions to support engagement and collaborative learning. It also provides accountability to support pupil's motivation while working remotely.

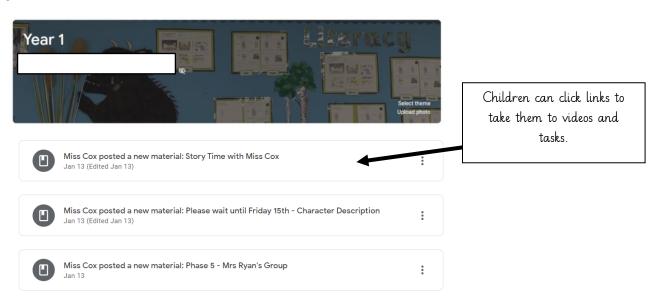
Therefore, Google Classroom is used to support all aspects of remote learning. This is a platform used to set tasks, quizzes and assignments in follow up to live or recorded sessions. Google Classroom can be accessed on laptops, tablets, smart phones, Xbox and PlayStation. User guides are published onto school website.



All staff have received guidance on this and all children have received personal log in details.



All class pages display work shared in children's classroom and regular contact from teachers. Children can find links on their class stream to lessons, wider curriculum challenges set by teachers across school, recorded assemblies and feedback.



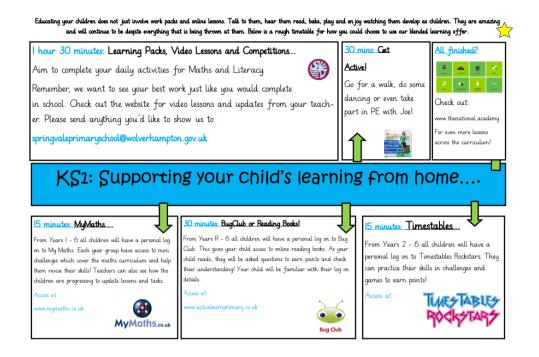
### Engagement and Accessibility

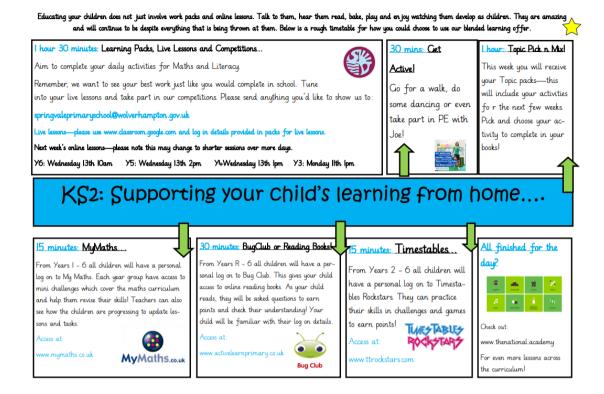
The school has developed systems to monitor engagement through pupil attendance and welfare phone calls. The school will target families with low engagement so that they can support remote learning. From tracking this engagement, the school, where possible, will loan equipment to children. In this instance, parents will be asked to sign a 'Shared Use Agreement'. Where this is not possible, children will continue to work through work packs which are delivered to all children weekly.

The website includes 'Supporting your child's learning from home' guides as well as an up to date timetable for live lessons. These guides show practical ways to use the blended remote learning package we offer. The Department for Education recommends that children in KSI have 3 hours of work set on average per day and KS2 children to complete 4 hours.





#### SEND Children

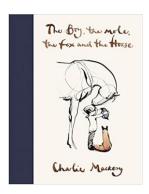
- Differentiated learning packs and tasks set by class teachers with focus on EHCP targets.
- Weekly phone call from SENDCo for children with an EHCP.
- Children under SEN Support receive fortnightly phone calls from external agency e.g. Educational Psychologist, Outreach Service and Specialist Teacher.

#### Vulnerable Children

- Weekly family welfare calls from LMT.
- BAMHs worker to contact all children with an assigned social worker or hold socially distanced face-to-face sessions with children attending school.
- Attendance tracking in place.

### Our sense of school community

At Spring Vale our sense of community is crucial to the development of our children. Through shared assemblies and wider curriculum challenges, children from all year groups will be able to access Google Classroom. All families will receive a copy of 'The Boy, The Mole and The Horse' from which, whole school PSHE, competitions and assembly tasks will be set.



## Safeguarding Considerations

Keeping children and staff safe when providing remote education is essential. Remote education is a new experience for both staff and pupils, so it's important

that schools understand how to approach safeguarding procedures online. Staff will be refreshed on safeguarding procedures prior to conducting lessons. Staff have all read Keeping Children Safe in Education Part I and the school's safeguarding policy.

#### ONLINE CLASSROOM RULES:



- Keep your microphone muted unless asked so that I can hear you and you can hear me.
- Raise hand
- Raise your hand if you would like to ask/ answer a question
- Turn camera off once we start our lesson
- Kind, sensible words and contributions please



 Use the 'End call' button once our lesson is finished your teacher will make sure this has happened before they end the call.

Staff will ensure adherence to protocols and share these with children at the start of online lessons. Chat features in online lessons and comment threads will only be used for an educational purpose and is monitored and read by an adult. When this cannot be monitored, this feature will be turned off.

Any concerns raised in sessions or issues relating to safeguarding need reporting to the DSL immediately and usual procedures followed.

### Individual child absent:

- They receive a work pack each week. This can be delivered if the family are self-isolating.
- The focus of learning will be in line with what the children are learning at school.
- Reading books provided through BugClub.
- Welfare phone call from member of staff.

## Process:

- I. Dates of isolation are recorded and added to SIMS.
- 2. Parents contacted to check all log on details for remote learning have been checked.
- 3. Class teacher to be given a list of children's names who are isolating at the beginning of each week.
