As part of our ongoing commitment to ensuring the safety of all children, parents, visitors and staff, please remember that the school car park should be treated the same as a road. - Use designated footpaths/crossings please ensure that you and your children stay on the marked footpaths to avoid walking in vehicular areas and use the crossings to cross safely. Crossing points ensure that you are visible to drivers.
- Avoid walking through the car park For your safety, do not cut across parking spaces or driving areas.
- A Be vigilant and hold children's hands Keep an eye on children and hold their hands when on the school site.
- A Respect Traffic Flow Be aware of moving vehicles and ensure children do not run in the car park area.

#### WORLD BOOK DAY DRESSING UP











































Level 2 and 3 training targets 8 - 15 year olds who will be instructed on how to ride their bikes to the Government approval National Standard for Cycle training.


# THE VEGINVASION ...HAS RETURNED!
