

PE Kit

We have had some parents asking if there could be an alternative to the current tracksuit bottoms available from Ron Flowers. Late to school

There are a number of children arriving late to school every day. Children who arrive late for school are missing the beginning of their first lesson. Can I please remind parents that all children must arrive at school between 8.30 am and 8.45 am. They

should enter school through their classroom door, not via the main office. We understand that some lateness is unavoidable but would ask that you telephone the school office to advise if your child is going to arrive late to school.

Leave of Absence

The Governing Body of Spring Vale Primary School are keen to maintain the school's very good attendance record. Our policy for leave of absence taken during term time is



























































in line with Local and National guidelines. Current legislation states that any application for leave of absence (holiday) must be in exceptional circumstances and must be approved by the Headteacher in advance of the leave being taken. The Headteacher must be satisfied that the circumstances warrant the granting of leave. The current law does not allow parents to take their child(ren) out of school during term time. Parents can be fined for taking their child(ren) out of school during term time without consent from the school.
