Free Family Cycling Day Out

A day of FREE summer fun outside with the whole family! Wolverhampton's popular Kidical Mass event is on Saturday 14 June 2025. This will be a day full of cycling, outdoor activities and hopefully sun!

Kidical Mass is a partnership between Wolverhampton City Council, No Limits to Health CIC, Sustrans, Cycling UK, British Cycling and Transport for West Midlands. These expert organisations are putting together a fantastic day which includes a led ride which is approximately 4.5 miles altogether.

The family friendly led ride starts in East Park heading to the Jack Hayward Monument at the Wolverhampton Wanderers Molineux Stadium. It then returns following the new cycle lane down the central reservation on the Stafford Rd Ring Road and trails back through the City Centre to return to East Park.

For those children and parents not taking part in the ride there will be a wide range of activities on the park including a bike skills track, face painting, dance performances, music, information stalls and more!
