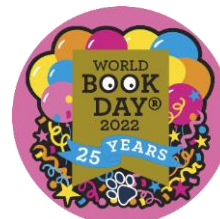

Happy World Book Day!

On **Friday 4th March**, we are all dressing up as book characters as part of our Book Week, celebrating books of all kinds. Your child can come to school dressed as a book character on that day. Ideas for costumes that your child might already have:

-  Cinderella , Snow White, Belle, Jasmin etc. – Princess costume
-  Marvel Comics – Hulk, Spiderman, Iron Man costume
-  Dc comics – Batman, Superman costume
-  Horrid Henry – blue and yellow jumper and jeans
-  Tracy Beaker – Striped jumper, jeans, messy hair
-  Mr Bump – Blue top, jeans, bandage around head
-  Cat in the Hat – white t-shirt, black jeans and cardigan. Red bow tie. Red and white top hat (could make it out of card).
-  Harry Potter/Hermione – uniform, black cape. Glasses/scarf/tie/wand.
-  The Hungry Caterpillar – Green top and trousers. Cut out shapes of fruit and stick onto top. Red mask or red face on headband.
-  Paddington – brown trousers, blue top/coat, red hat, red wellies.
