Parking (Emergency vehicles/zigzags)



Anyone collecting a child by car must never park on the school zigzags. This is a road traffic offence and you may receive a fine. The zigzags are there to keep children safe. Data Collection Sheets

The flu vaccines are carried out annually by Vaccination UK and will be done in school on Tuesday 23rd November. All parents should have received a consent form which needs to be completed and returned to school. The vaccine is given as a spray which is squirted up each
