Back to School September 2021

You should have received a 2021/22 academic year planner with your child's report. Children in Years 1 - 6 return to school on Monday 6th September. Existing Nursery children return on 6th September. New Reception and Nursery children have been given their start dates and times.

School Times



The KS1 and KS2 playground gates will be opened at 8.30 am when children are let into school. All children should be in their rooms by 8.45 am which is the official start to the school day. If a child arrives at school before 8.30 am there is no staff supervision and the child remains the responsibility of the parent/carer. **Any child arriving after 8.45 am will be marked as late in the register.**

Years Reception, 3, 4, 5 and 6 finish at **3 pm** and Years 1 and 2 finish at **3.10 pm**.

Nursery: Morning nursery session times are 8.30 - 11.30 am.

Afternoon nursery session times are 12.15 pm - 3.15 pm.

Covid-19 update

As children return to school they will notice subtle changes we are making in order to continue to keep everyone safe whilst returning to some sense of normality.

Children will not need to stay in bubbles, however, interaction between year groups will be limited to lunchtimes, playtimes, assemblies and after school activities. They will be taught at all times within their year groups.

Staff and parents can continue to wear face coverings when on site, although this is not compulsory.

If a child or member of staff feels unwell, the advice is to get a test. Positive tests within a class will not mean all children will need to be sent home. Only the child/member of staff who is positive will need to isolate.

In short, we are easing restrictions in order to raise standards but we are not ending them entirely.
