

#### End of Year Report from Mr West (Chair of Governors)

I was wondering today, "what is normal?" Those of us who work in a public sector organisation are used to change, and looking on at the current leadership contest, I anticipate more change. Politicians like to meddle, especially with the way Health or Education is delivered, they see it as a way of making their mark and in the meantime those of us working in the service just have to get on delivering the best service we can alongside, or sometimes, despite the changes that those that govern decide to make.

Yesterday I watched my eldest graduate in Biomedical Science and shortly my youngest will be starting to train to become a teacher. It makes me proud, not only as a parent seeing their children do well, but also as a Governor of the school which helped get them to where they are now. I know that both of them will be happy to acknowledge the significant role that Spring Vale had in getting them to where they wanted to be, and we as a Governing Body are happy to know that there are so many others out there in the same position as them.

#### Back to School September 2022

You should have received a 2022/23 academic year planner with your child's report. Children in Years 1 – 6 return to school on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> September. Existing Nursery children (who will remain to Nursery) on 12<sup>th</sup> September. New Reception and Nursery children have been given their start dates and times.

#### School Times



The KS1 and KS2 playground gates will be opened at 8.30 am when children are let into school. All children should be in their rooms by 8.45 am which is the official start to the school day. If a child arrives at school before 8.30 am there is no staff supervision and the child remains the responsibility of the parent/carer. <u>Any child arriving after 8.45 am will be marked as</u> <u>late in the register</u>.

Years Reception, 3, 4, 5 and 6 finish at **3 pm** Years 1 and 2 finish at **3.10 pm**.

Nursery: Morning nursery session times are 8.30 - 11.30 am. Afternoon nursery session times are 12.15 pm - 3.15 pm.

#### School Uniform

Please make sure your child is kitted out with the correct uniform for next term. Also make sure your child has <u>black low heeled shoes not trainers</u> for school. Socks should be plain white, black or grey.

Jewellery is not allowed to be worn in school.

<u>Extreme hairstyles are not allowed in school - as outlined in the school prospectus.</u>



This year, we will be insisting on a maroon hoodie or jumper and navy joggers to be worn to school on class PE days. Our school uniform is available from Ron Flowers

Sports, Queen Street, Wolverhampton. There is a link on our website to enable parents to order online or you can purchase directly from the shop. Alternatively, school colours can be sourced from a number of different supermarkets and shops. Children will not be allowed to wear random PE kit to school after this academic year.

#### PRE LOVED SCHOOL UNIFORM

If any families would like to donate any pre-loved uniform to school, we will be holding a pre-loved uniform sale at different points during next academic year. If as a family you are struggling with uniform or PE kit, please let us know at school and we will do our best to help you.

### School Dinners

Why not try our school dinners for a term? Dinner money in September 2022 will remain at  $\pounds$ 2.40 per day,  $\pounds$ 12.00 per week ( $\pounds$ 1.40 per day,  $\pounds$ 7.00 per week for flexible charging) payable on the first day of the week. Children need to state at the beginning of a term whether they are having dinners or packed lunches. We are not increasing the cost for school dinners this year even though the price of raw materials has increased significantly. Our aim is not to pass on any of these costs to our families. However, we will need to review this as we progress through the academic year.



A full program of after school clubs will be sent out on our return to school in September.

#### Tips for keeping children safe online

Recently, Year 5 and 6 have had some training from a visitor about how they can stay safe online. Next academic year, we will be holding some parent sessions as well as updates for staff. Look out for these details when we return for the new academic year. In the meantime here are some tips to keep children safe over the holiday:-



- Explore: Explore and understand the apps, games and sites your child uses and get to know your child's online world better
- Talk: Chat to your child about their online world, just as you'd ask about their day at School
- Agree: Set out the family rules to live well online. Discuss and agree ground rules and make sure you're a good role model
- Manage: Make the technology work for you. Adapt privacy settings and use parental controls where necessary
